Teaching and Learning at St Paul's

At St Paul's we have established a model of teaching and learning which informs all of our lesson planning and drives professional development throughout our school.

The Teacher Effectiveness Programme (TEEP) was set up in 2002 by the Gatsby Charitable Foundation to develop a model of effective teaching and learning drawn from research and best practice. All St Paul's teaching staff have now been trained to Level 1, with a plan in place for some staff to train to Level 2. Training has been provided by our national Support School, All Hallows Catholic College, who also lead on training staff in schools nationally. The TEEP Model

The TEEP model of Effective Teaching for Effective Learning was developed in response to the needs of education systems, schools, teachers and students. It is a framework with a strong pedagogical foundation, to support a consistent approach to Teaching and Learning.



The TEEP model draws on significant research (Hay McBer, Reynolds and Muijs.) that has identified what is required of teachers and of learners in order for them to gain the best learning outcomes possible. The model, represented in the graphic opposite is made up of three significant components each with important elements that are inextricably connected yet need to be recognised individually for their contribution to the teaching and learning process.

The model includes a six part lesson planning cycle (in the center) which is built on what we know about effective learning. The stages of learning are shared with students so they can reflect on how to improve their own learning.
