Rewards and Sanctions Policy 2018-2019

I would like to take this opportunity to inform you about some important changes to our Rewards and Sanctions Policy here at St. Paul's. This year many of our students have been able to accrue Achievement Points for good or improved effort, achievement and attendance. These points have then resulted in Achievement Certificates and ultimately rewards including reduced ticket prices for the Year 11 Prom, financial contributions towards the end of year Rewards Trip and invitations to a variety of events and trips throughout the year. It is our intention to enhance this even further to ensure that **all students who are determined to succeed in their lessons and are accepting the challenge of learning every day should be rewarded for their efforts.**

From time to time, students make poor decisions regarding the behaviour for learning they display in class or around the school. It is vital that we challenge and sanction poor behaviours as crucial learning time can be lost both for the child involved and other students. If your child behaves in a selfish or disrespectful way they could be removed from class and placed into isolation for the rest of that period. They will then be collected at **the end of the same school day** and complete a thirty minute detention until 3.35 pm (3.25 pm on Wednesdays). **You will receive a text message from school informing you of the detention that day.** You may have to arrange a different mode of transport home for your child as the school buses will have left before this time. **If a student is removed twice during the same day from lessons they will spend a full day in Isolation and have an extended school day until 3.35 pm** (3.25 pm on Wednesdays). Again, you may have to arrange a different mode of transport home for your child as the school buses will have left before this time. With this in mind, it is essential that you update your mobile/contact details at the earliest opportunity.

I have included two documents which further illustrate the type of learning behaviours which will lead to either rewards or sanctions. Please take time to discuss these with your child and reinforce the message that learning time cannot be wasted if all of our students are to realise their potential.
