


# Chaplaincy Curriculum Map

**Whole school mass: Tuesday 28 June** †  
A celebration for our schools Saint's feast day which lies on Wednesday 29 June. St Peter & St Paul's day is an activity day to show our appreciation for the first Apostle and Pope of Jesus Christ.



**Easter Sunday: Sunday 17 April**  
Celebrating the resurrection of Jesus after the third according to scripture.

**Love**  
To finish off our school year we look towards one of the most important aspects of Catholic life. Loving one another is the key teaching that Jesus taught to us during His time on Earth. We look towards the end of our school year and look to the future in love.

**Stewardship**  
Following from focussing on service and understanding the importance of our faith, our core value focus for Summer 1 looks at our faith in action. What can we do as Catholics to influence the world. Being good stewards is one of the most important aspects of Catholic life, with Pope Francis showing this through his encyclical 'Laudato Si'. A focus is placed on the importance of faith at this time in the Churches calendar, with our focus being placed on the individual, and how we are influential in our community to our faith in Jesus.

**Ash Wednesday: Wednesday 2 March**  
In school celebration of Jesus' fasting in the desert and rejection of desires. The start of our Lenten period

**Whole school mass: Monday 4 April**

**Respect**  
As we return back from a time of celebration after the Christmas period we come back to our core value focus of respect. Starting a new year with a focus on respecting others and developing our students to becoming thoughtful and respectful members of the community.

**Baptism of the Lord: Sunday 9 January**

A celebration of Jesus' visit from the Magi, confirming that Jesus was not only the Messiah of the Jews, but also the saviour of the Gentiles (everybody else that is not part of the Jewish faith).
