Autumn Learning Journey

Year 7- Creation & Covenant/Prophecy & Promise: Students begin by considering how creation is at the heart of God's relationship with humans, followed by studying Jesus the fulness of revelation in whom God says all there is to say.

Year 8- Tradition and Vocation/Signs of Catholic Identity- Students have an opportunity to examine Christian practices and beliefs.

Year 9- Islam/Peace & Conflict- Year 9 begin by studying the life and practice of another Abrahamic faith followed by a module on understanding the causes of war and religious responses to this.

Year 10- Origins & Meanings- Year 10 are looking at different beliefs about the creation of the world, sanctity of life, stewardship and Catholic social teaching.

Year 11- Sin & Forgiveness- Year 11 are studying different beliefs about punishment, forgiveness, salvation and evangelisation.

KS3 classes have knowledge organisers with keywords and activities that they must complete every fortnight.

Year 10 have revision guides and work is set from them each week to be completed at home independently.

Year 11 have banks of past exam questions to be completed each fortnight and access to resources on the shared portal.

Chaplaincy/Catholic life

- On Thursday 15th September we have our Open Evening which is an opportunity for prospective pupils to come and have a look at the school.
- On Thursday 29th September we celebrate our Year 7 Welcome Evening- We are looking forward
 to welcoming our Year 7 parents/carers to a special service led by our students about our St Paul's
 ethos and core values. There will be an opportunity to meet with form tutors informally
 afterwards.
- Wythenshawe Foodbank Appeal- in keeping with Jesus' message about feeding the hungry, we will be collecting non-perishable items for some of our local foodbanks. There is always a fantastic response from the St Paul's community.
