BIRTH: In the next couple of weeks an attempt will be made to decriminalise abortion up to birth. The pro-abortion lobby is framing their proposal as an offert to save women from criminalisation and that is

effort to save women from criminalisation and that is gaining support by blinding people to the full picture of what is at stake. It means that a woman who induced her abortion at home using pills (or any other method) at any stage of pregnancy, including just before natural birth, would not commit a crime.

We cannot overstate the seriousness of the threat. to our society. This extreme amendment to the Criminal Justice Bill is being made by Diana Johnson MP and parliamentarians will be under pressure to support the amendment on grounds of compassion for mothers who seek to abort their unborn child beyond the legal limits. It is vitally important we make our voices heard in support of the unborn child.
